A WESTSIDE

C RIDGETOP

The summit of Civita, where larger, attached single-family homes enjoy acres of surrounding open space

D THE TERRACES

A neighborhood of view condominiums separated by charming parks and paseos.

E THE STEPS

An urban residential enclave on the park's edge.
Centrally located to the retail and entertainment district.



Two partners. One vision.

In the early 1900s, Franklin and Alta Grant fell in love with a particular piece of land along the San Diego River. Hoping to find oil, Franklin discovered rock instead, and the family mined the property for over 70 years. Many of San Diego's buildings, roads and highways are built with aggregate from the quarry. Their grandchildren, the Grant cousins, were inspired to turn their family legacy into a walkable village centered around a large public park that fosters community connectivity.

In the early 2000s, after 30 years of building mixed-use and commercial developments throughout San Diego, Sudberry Properties, a local family-owned company, was looking for an opportunity to create a community that integrated the latest design trends with current sustainability practices.
